2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) DPH LRN Laboratory Specimen Submission Guidelines for El Paso County Healthcare Facilities

DPH LRN Laboratory will now be performing COVID-19 PCR testing. Below are the guidelines for specimen submission.

- 1. Health care providers must contact **El Paso Department of Public Health (DPH)**<u>immediately</u> if the facility has a patient under investigation (PUI) for COVID-19. The contact information is at the end of this document.
- DPH Epidemiology (EPI) will coordinate the investigation and determine whether COVID-19 testing is approved. If it is approved, the EPI will fill out the "Interim 2019 novel coronavirus (COVID-19) patient under investigation (PUI) form" and notify DPH Laboratory of COVID-19 testing approval
- 3. **Three specimens** types must be collected for each patient: 2 upper respiratory (*e.g.*, nasopharyngeal swab and oropharyngeal swab collected on swabs with a synthetic tip and an aluminum or plastic shaft in viral or universal transport media), 1 lower respiratory (*e.g.*, sputum, bronchoalveolar lavage [2-3 mL], tracheal aspirate[2-3 mL]) Each **specimen** must have:
 - a. DPH Laboratory Submission Form
 - b. CDC Form 50.34
- 4. Maintain proper infection control when collecting specimens. Review CDC Biosafety Practice Guidelines for more information: https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-nCoV/lab/lab-biosafety-guidelines.html.
- 5. Store specimens at 2-4°C promptly after collection. Samples can be sent to the DPH Laboratory at 2-4°C if they will be received within 72 hours. Samples that will received after 72 hours must be frozen at -70°C. Notify DPH Laboratory before delivering samples. Samples can be received M-F 8-5 PM. For weekends and holidays, please call DPH Epidemiology. Delivery windows for weekends and holidays will be coordinated with DPH EPI and Laboratory between 10:30 am 11:30 am. Please follow proper shipping protocols for Category B specimens. The laboratory delivery address is listed at the end of this document.

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6. Specimen rejection criteria include:

- a. Incomplete specimen submission form or specimen label
- b. Inappropriate specimen type
- c. Insufficient specimen volume
- d. NP and OP swabs collected with calcium alginate or cotton tips with wooden shafts
- e. Specimens not received at the proper temperature (i.e., refrigerated between 2-4°C or frozen on dry ice at -70°C)
- 7. Testing results will be sent to EPI and the submitting facility. Any presumptive positive samples will be sent to the CDC for confirmatory testing.
